

BUILDING SAFETY ACT POLICY

POLICY BRIEF & PURPOSE

The Building Safety Act 2022 (BSA) became law in April 2022. This Act imposes specific duties on companies and individuals involved in the design, construction and end use of high rise residential and some commercial buildings.

Statement of Intent

Actua accepts its duties and responsibilities as defined in the BSA and will not only comply with the legislation but will strive to improve health and safety standards as part of our activities by adopting a pro-active approach to the management of health and safety.

POLICY ELEMENTS

Duties & Responsibilities
